On January 28, John Murray will be sharing from Luke 10:25-37 and his sermon title is *Lessons in asking the wrong questions*. This is what John has to say about the sermon: "The message will be an autobiographical journey of my shifting understanding of the meaning of the parable that we often (wrongly I would argue) entitled 'The Good Samaritan'. The broader context of the story, along with my own personal spiritual journey, has deepened and enriched my understanding of this parable that Jesus told to a religious lawyer who didn't really like his own, correct answer to his own question. This has become one of my personal defining scriptures. For me it has come to define true religion. what eternal life is all about, and the surprising places (surprising to us anyway) that we can learn such truths."

The next book for our **NCFC Book Club** is *Parable of the Sower* by Octavia Butler. The suggested reading schedule is below and we will still meet once a month on Wednesdays!

Jan 31st – the beginning of the book through Chapter 8

Feb 28th – Chapters 9-18

Note from the A/V team: As we learn to operate the new sound system, we are still experimenting with what works, and what works less well. We appreciate your comments, after the service, to let us know what your experience was like. This will help us make adjustments for the next Sunday. We have four sound mixes that we are managing on Sunday mornings, and until we figure out, and train for, the best settings for each mix, we need to set priorities for the limited resource of our experience.

What this looks like for now, is the following:

First priority: sound in the sanctuary

Second priority: sound for those who need hearing assistance

Third priority: sound for those worshipping online

Fourth priority: stage monitors

If you are in the sanctuary and have an issue with sound that needs immediate attention, please reach out to the person designated in the bulletin as A/V runner. They are there to pass that information to the sound booth as soon as possible. If you are online, send a text via Zoom. The sound operator in the booth needs to focus on dozens of things at once to manage all of the microphones and sound feeds...and we are triaging our efforts as we learn. We will make mistakes. Please be patient with us from 10:30 until noon....then let us know what you think!

FreedUp: New Creation has been a partner church with Everence for many years, and individuals have benefitted from both their counsel and services. Something new for 2024 is FreedUp, an app-based program with a workbook to help people develop strong habits for personal finances. Each person or couple completes lessons on their app, then Everence facilitators will lead small discussion groups; seven, including the first get-acquainted session.
