Childcare is provided following *Children's Time* for children 2nd grade and younger. Also, a changing table and rocking chair are in the basement.

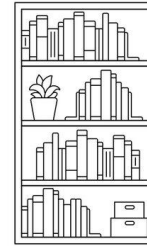
