CONGREGATIONAL MEETINGS are held monthly on the second Sunday of the month before worship.

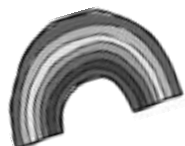

Innovations In Living With Dementia on Wednesday, June 26, 2019 from 6 PM to 9 PM at Hesston Mennonite Church, featuring National Alzheimer's Researcher: Dr. Jeffrey M. Burns, MD, MS. Dr. Burns is the co-director of the KU Alzheimer's Disease Center and also directs the Frontiers Clinical and Translational Science Unit and the Alzheimer and Memory Clinic. A native Kansan, Dr. Burns returned to Kansas City in 2004 to start the Alzheimer's disease clinical research program. Dr. Burns' research program supports clinical trials testing new approaches to treating Alzheimer's disease and a variety of research projects focused on how lifestyle issues such as diet and exercise can be used to prevent or delay the onset of Alzheimer's disease.
